- Attendance Motivations: The reasons behind attending the festival.
- Satisfaction Levels: Evaluations of several festival components, such as the venue, acts, and overall experience.
- Challenges Faced: Ask open-ended questions about any obstacles you ran into while there.

Sample

Two hundred questionnaires were gathered from a wide range of international travelers. In-depth interviews with 25 participants were also carried out, who supplied more detailed qualitative information about their experiences.

Information Analysis

Descriptive statistics (SPSS) were used to examine the quantitative data, and theme analysis (NVivo) was used to analyze the qualitative data from the interviews. Based on recurrent patterns and insights about the challenges, satisfaction, and motives of tourists, themes were discovered.

Findings

Visitor Profiles

The survey participants' demographic analysis showed a varied mix of visitors to the festival:

- Age: Of the participants, 55% were between the ages of 25 and 40, 30% were between the ages of 41 and 60, and 15% were between the ages of 18 and 24.
- Nationality: About 65% of those surveyed were foreign visitors, with the majority coming from Australia (10%), North America (20%), and Europe (35%). 35% of the visitors came from within

- Occupation: Professionals made up 40% of the respondents, with students coming in second at 25%, retirees at 20%, and artists or entertainers at 15%.

Motivations for Attendance

Participants' primary reasons for participating were as follows:

- 1. Appreciation of Culture: A lot of visitors indicated that they were very interested in seeing India's traditional arts and rich cultural legacy.
- 2. Artistic Engagement: One of the main draws for guests was the chance to see performances by well-known dancers.
- 3. Social Interaction: Several travelers emphasized the value of getting to know like-minded people and participating in cross-cultural interactions.
- 4. Historical Exploration: Many visitors were also drawn to Khajuraho by the temples' architectural beauty and historical relevance.

Overall Satisfaction

Satisfaction levels among tourists were overwhelmingly positive, with 90% of respondents rating their experience as "excellent."

Specific findings included:

- Performance Quality: Noting the dancers' talent and skill, 95% of participants complimented the show's caliber.
- Venue Atmosphere: According to 92% of respondents, the picturesque setting of the temples improved the entire experience.
- Festival Organization: Although 80% of visitors thought the event was well-run, a few pointed out that communication and logistics should have been strengthened.

Challenges Faced

Despite the high levels of pleasure, travelers mentioned a few difficulties.

- 1. Accommodation Issues: A lot of respondents brought up the lack of accommodations, especially on festival days when demand is highest and it might be challenging to locate acceptable places to stay.
- 2. Transportation Logistics: Tourists faced issues linked to local transportation, with suggestions for increased shuttle services and clearer signage.
- 3. Information Accessibility: A few participants voiced their wish for easier access to information about festival events and performance schedules.
